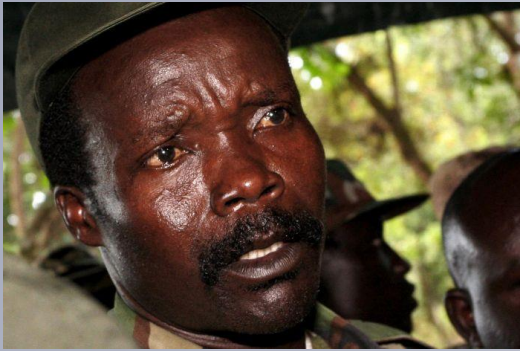
Civil War (1983-2005)

- 2 million+ killed
- 4 million+ displaced as refugees
- War/genocide killed 20% of the people
 - US: 300 million+ people
 - *Equivalent to 60 million+ Americans or the combined population of CA and NY*
 - Omar Al Bashir (*President of Sudan*)
 - ICC indictment and arrest warrant for war crimes and genocide
- Peace Accord signed in 2005
- Free Elections held in 2011
 - 99% voted for independence

Pure (*pronounced "Poo-Ray"*)

- 5000+ villagers





Joseph Kony / LRA

- Raids villages and abducts children
- Forces the boys to kill their parents and turns them into child soldiers
- Forces the girls to become servants

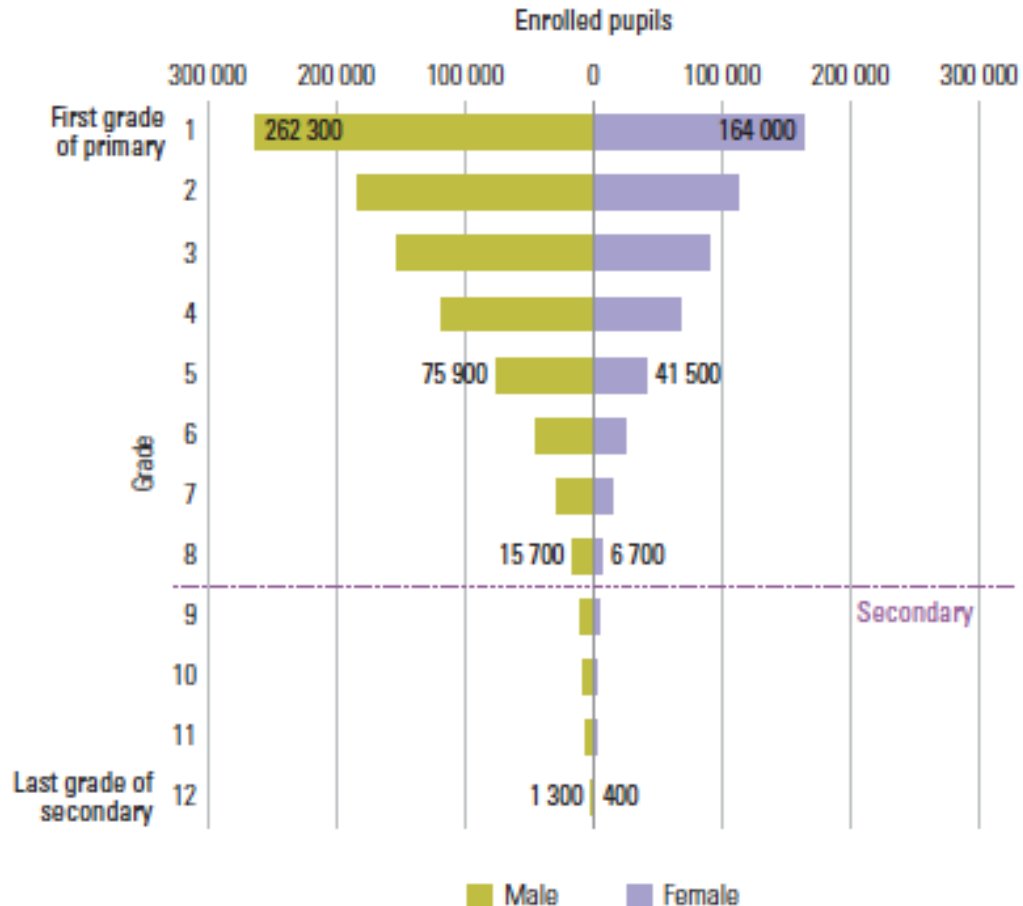
Education

- 80% of the population is illiterate
 - 90% of women are illiterate
- 50% school age children never attend school, of those who have:
 - 26% finish 6th grade
 - 8% finish 8th grade
 - <1% finish 12th grade
- **Children in South Sudan are more likely to die before the age of 5 than they are to complete the 4th grade**
- Pure (2012)
 - Only school was P1-P4
 - 103 Total Students
 - Only 20% were continuing past 4th grade
 - Nearest P5-P8: 3 mile hike to Uganda
 - None in 8th grade or above

The trickle-down effect:

few children make it through primary school

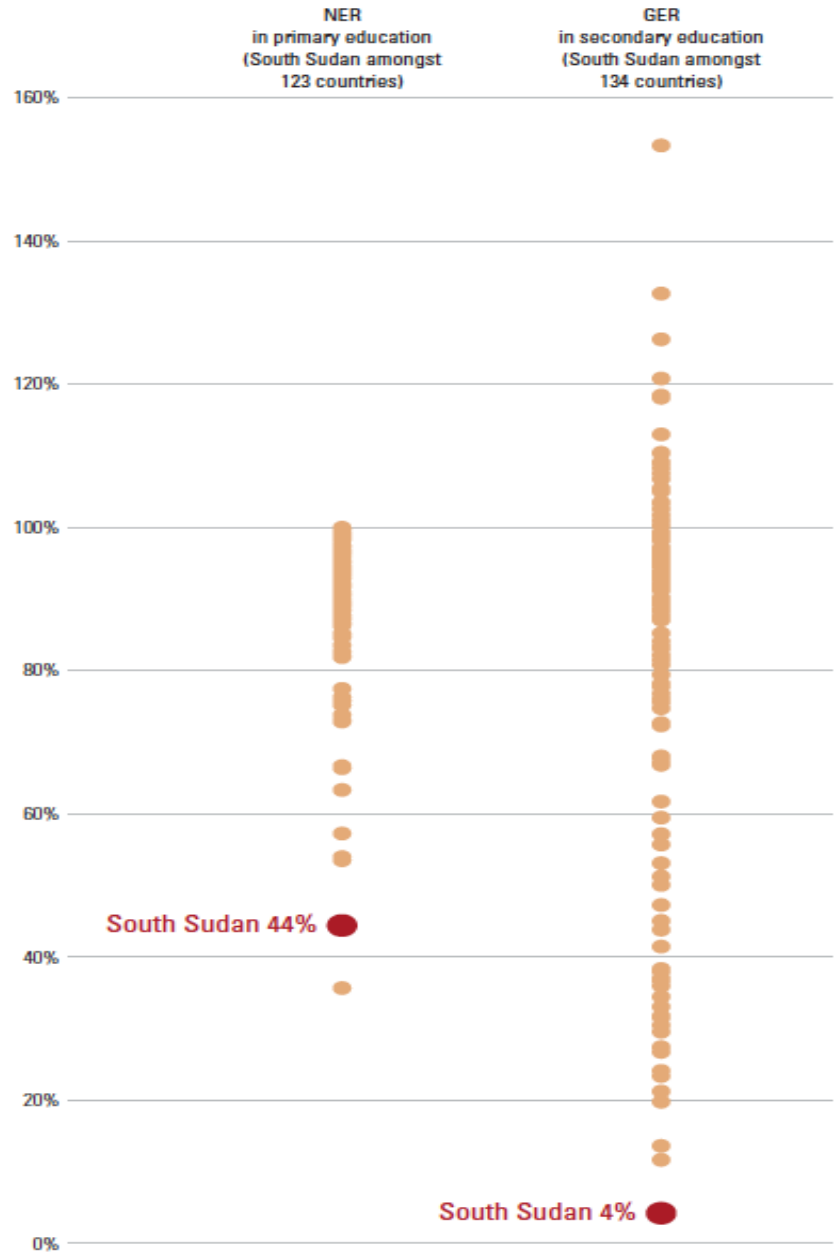
Education

- UNESCO Evaluation
 - Primary Schools – 2nd Worst of 123 countries
 - Secondary Schools – Worst of 134 countries
- Highest Gender Inequality
 - Only 400 girls in 12th grade
 - **A girl in South Sudan is 3x more likely to die in pregnancy or childbirth than to reach the 8th grade**



South Sudan starts independence at the bottom of the world league table for education

Health Initiatives

- Drilled a clean water well at the new school
 - Projected to drop disease rates by 60-70%
- Supporting Mobile Health Clinics
 - Medical staff visits monthly
 - Provided self adjusting eyeglasses (Eyejusters)



Needed / Planned

- Community Health Worker training
- Community Health Unit
 - Nearest medical facility is 4 hour walk from Pure
 - Government commitment to move staff and equipment
 - Public/Private/Community project to build the facility
 - Projected cost of \$30,000

Solar Initiatives

- “Light the Night” Program
 - Provided 300+ solar lights
 - “Support a Student”
 - “Support a Senior”



- Solar lighting system for new P1-P4
 - Will also be used for an Adult Education Program beginning in 2014



Education Initiatives

- Drilled water well at new P1-P4
- Solar lighting system on P1-P4
- Solar lights for the students
- Opened Preschool
 - 28 students began in Mar 2013
- Provided 700+ reading books
- July 2012: 4 grades / 103 students
- **July 2013: 6 grades / 183 students**

Needed / Planned

- Permanent latrines
 - Projected cost of \$4000
- P5-P8 facility
 - Public/Private/Community project
 - Projected cost of \$50,000
 - ~50% of funding raised
